Embrace the great outdoors

Chipping Norton sits on one of the highest points of the North Cotswolds, surrounded by rolling hills and woodlands that are just waiting to be explored. Just a short stroll from the high street, circular walks will take you past Bliss Mill, a historic wool mill building dating back to 1872 which has stunning views of the countryside. One of the standout landmarks is the Rollright Stones, often referred to as one of the Seven Wonders of the Cotswolds.

This highly sought-after town is also well-connected to nearby villages, making it ideal for shorter day walks. Popular routes include walks to Kingham, known for its idyllic setting and gastropubs, and Salford, a quiet village with traditional Cotswold stone cottages. For those seeking longer adventures, the Glyme Valley Walk is a 16-mile trail that follows the River Glyme from Chipping Norton to Woodstock. Whether it's a morning walk, a weekend hike, or a picnic with friends, the outdoors here is a refreshing escape into nature and is rich with history.



Everything on your doorstep

With Chipping Norton's charming high street just a short drive away, and plenty of amenities located even closer to home, you'll have everything you need at your fingertips. There's a Little Waitrose convenience store situated a walk away from Bliss Willows, while the nearby retail park offers a Costa Coffee and an M&S Foodhall.

Alternatively, head into town where you'll find Sainsbury's and Co-op supermarkets, a post office, pharmacy and independent shops including a butcher's, bakery and fishmonger.

For lovers of local produce and artisan goods, the Chipping Norton Farmer's Market takes place on the third Saturday of every month, offering fresh, seasonal fare from nearby farms and producers. In addition, the Outdoor Market has stalls selling everything from handmade crafts to delicious street food. The lively high street is the ideal spot to spend a leisurely Saturday afternoon, at its independent shops, cafés and restaurants, or in a characterful pub; the perfect place to unwind.

Perfectly located, well connected

Bliss Willows is a convenient base for commuters and explorers alike. Regular bus services run to Oxford, and the A44 provides direct access while Banbury is just 25 minutes away via the A361. The M40 close by also offers swift connection to Birmingham, London and beyond.

Kingham and Charlbury train stations are nearby, offering direct train links to Oxford, Worcester, Reading and London Paddington.

Nearby Cotswolds villages, including Charlbury, Woodstock, Moreton in Marsh, Stow-on-the-Wold and Shipston on Stour, are all easy accessible, thanks to regular bus services.



Top of the class for education

You won't need to go far to find excellent education options. Holy Trinity Catholic School, St Mary's Church of England Primary School and Great Rollright Primary School are all highly-rated choices for younger children.

For older students, Chipping Norton School, Shipston High School and Kingham Hill School all come highly recommended. And for higher education, Bliss Willows couldn't be better placed. Banbury, Bicester, Abingdon and Witney all have colleges within easy reach, while the University of Oxford's dreamy spires are less than an hour away.



Fun days out, for all the family

With its wide range of leisure attractions and packed calendar of year-round events and festivals, there will always be something new to see and enjoy in and around Chipping Norton. Jeremy Clarkson's famous Diddly Squat Farm and shop is close by, while for little ones, Fairytale Farm offers enchanting tales, interactive exhibits, adventure play and animals to meet.

Heythrop Zoo provides a unique, appointment-only experience and is just 10 minutes away, focusing on animal welfare, behaviour education, and inspiring future guardians of nature. As a private facility, it provides unforgettable wildlife encounters in a peaceful and enriching setting.

Soho Farmhouse is an exclusive countryside escape known for its rustic luxury and celebrity appeal, with family-friendly activities including horse-riding, boating and biking as well as creative spaces for a memorable and relaxed day out in the Cotswolds.

Places to go



Eating out – The Chequers and historic Blue Boar pubs are on the high street, along with the vibrant Whistlers Bar and Restaurant. Popular pop-up eatery Pit Kitchen, located off the Todenham Road, serves sizzling Mediterranean and Middle Eastern fare, while the Kingham Plough and Wild Rabbit hotel are also well thought of locally.



Sports and leisure – With a 25-metre swimming pool, four-court sports hall, exercise classes and a fully-equipped gym, Chipping Norton Leisure Centre will have all your fitness needs covered. The Chipping Norton Lido is ideal for families, with two heated outdoor pools, paddling pool, lawn and café. Families will also love the local parks and green spaces, while outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy everything from horse riding and golf to rugby, tennis and cricket at nearby clubs.



History and heritage – For a fascinating glimpse into the area's past, the Rollright Stones are the perfect place to start. Their King's Men stone circle, Whispering Knights burial chamber and single King Stone span nearly 2,000 years of the Neolithic and Bronze Age periods. The 19th century Bliss Tweed Mill is also essential for anyone wanting to learn about Chipping Norton's origins as a wool town. Just a short drive away, the majestic Blenheim Palace – birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill features expansive parkland and stunning architecture.





Things to do



Parks and nature – The wide array of open green spaces in the surrounding area includes the elegant Cornbury Park country estate, with its farmland, deer park and ancient forest. Nature lovers will also want to explore tranquil Fitzalan Wood.



Entertainment – Film fans can catch all the latest blockbusters at the Living Room Cinema, while The Theatre Chipping Norton runs a varied programme of drama, comedy and music. There are also annual music festivals, along with festive highlights like the Christmas tractor run, the town's lights switch-on, and the ever-popular pantomime season.



Shopping – If you're looking for a spot of retail therapy, Chipping Norton's diverse mix of independent boutiques are of course moments away. There is also a weekly market every Wednesday, and a monthly farmer's market. In the mood for something a bit different? Daylesford Farm has one of the UK's most stylish farm shops, selling organic produce, and with places to eat and drink too. For household name stores and designer brands, Banbury is just 12 miles from home, while Bicester, Cheltenham and Oxford are nearby to explore.



Family days out – There are plenty of attractions nearby to help keep your little ones entertained. Waterfowl Sanctuary and Children's Farm is home to a host of animals for youngsters to meet, while the magnificent, world-famous Blenheim Palace has beautiful gardens to walk in and an adventure play area for children. Cotswolds Wildlife Park & Gardens allows families to get up close to a wide range of animals.





Getting around



By foot: You'll find a park, school, convenience store and supermarkets all within walking distance.



By car: Bliss Willows offers excellent transport links, with direct routes to London and Birmingham via M40 junctions 10 and 11, direct access to Oxford and Evesham on the A44, and Banbury via the A361.



By rail: Kingham station offers regular services to Oxford, Cheltenham, Reading and Worcester, with direct trains to London Paddington in around 1 hour and 22 minutes.
